The spike mutations are identified on the SARS-CoV-2 Omicron variant (Pango lineage: BA.2.86/Denmark/EPI_ISL_18114953). The recombinant protein is expressed from human 293 cells (HEK293) with T4 fibritin trimerization motif and a polyhistidine tag at the C-terminus. Proline substitutions (F817P, A892P, A899P, A942P, K986P, V987P) and alanine substitutions (R683A and R685A) are introduced to stabilize the trimeric prefusion state of SARS-CoV-2 S protein and abolish the furin cleavage site, respectively.

Predicted N-terminus: Val 16

Molecular Characterization

This protein carries a polyhistidine tag at the C-terminus.

The protein has a calculated MW of 138 kDa. The protein migrates as 180.0 kDa when calibrated against <u>Star Ribbon Pre-stained Protein Marker</u> under reducing (R) condition (SDS-PAGE).

Purity

>90% as determined by SDS-PAGE.

Lyophilized from 0.22 µm filtered solution in PBS with trehalose as protectant.

Storage


For long term storage, the product should be stored at lyophilized state at -20 $^{\circ}$ C or lower.

This product is stable after storage at:


- -20°C to -70°C for 12 months in lyophilized state;



It's been reported that coronavirus can infect the human respiratory epithelial cells through interaction with the human ACE2 receptor. The spike protein is a large type I transmembrane protein containing two subunits, S1 and S2. S1 mainly contains a receptor binding domain (RBD), which is responsible for recognizing the cell surface receptor. S2 contains basic elements needed for the membrane fusion. The S protein plays key parts in the induction of neutralizing-antibody and T-cell responses, as well as protective immunity.
